

General FAQs



WHAT IS IT?

The City of Page is hosting, for the first time, a 3v3 Street Fest Basketball Tournament. Each court will play in their own unique tournament bracket in an outdoor, half court setting. Get some of your friends together to make teams of 3-4 players and register for your appropriate age division and gendered or co-ed sub-division.

WHEN IS IT? WHATS THE SCHEDULE?

The weekend of March 24-26, 2023. Teams and volunteers can check-in on Friday evening and there will be games throughout the day on Saturday and on Sunday. Each team is guaranteed 3 games though the exact bracket style may vary based on enrollment and some teams may play more than 3 games. Based on the information provided on their registration forms, teams will be assigned to a particular tournament bracket and court. Teams will receive their bracket schedule at least 1 week prior to the event and again at Check-In from Event HQ. Folks can also refer to the Brackets page to see bracket schedule and updates.

WHEN TO REGISTER?

Now! Registration will close on February 10 or as soon as the event reaches capacity.

HOW LONG ARE THE GAMES?

Each game is 20 minutes long. However, the target score for all games is 20 points, meaning the first team to reach 20 points will be declared the winner and the game might end early.

WHAT ARE THE RULES?

This is 3v3 Street Ball, not the NBA. Games will be played outdoors on ½ courts, so the rules and regulations might be different than what you're accustomed to using. Click <u>here</u> to get familiar with our rules.

WHAT TO WEAR? WHAT TO BRING?

We recommend that all participants (players, coaches, volunteers and even spectators) wear comfortable athletic clothing and tennis shoes. Bring lots of water, sunscreen and snacks. Players on the same team should coordinate to wear the same or similar colored clothes so that they are easy to identify from their opponents.



Registration FAQs



WHAT ARE THE DIVISIONS?

Here is the breakdown for all the division options available this year:

- Middle School Division (ages 11-13)
 - O All teams in the Youth Division must be Co-Ed (with at least 1 male and at least 1 female player rostered and playing at all times.)
- High School Division (ages 14-18)
 - o Co-Ed (at least 1 male and 1 female player rostered and playing at all times)
 - o All Male
 - o All Female
- Adult Division (ages 18+)
 - o Co-Ed (at least 1 male and 1 female player rostered and playing at all times)
 - o All Male
 - o All Female

HOW TO? HOW MUCH?

Click <u>here</u> to register a team. Select the age division and co-ed or gendered sub-division that appropriately includes your team's players. To constitute as a full team, you must register at least 3 players and no more than 4 players. Middle School teams will need to assign an adult as their coach while High School and Adult Teams will just need a player to represent the team as the "Captain."

It costs \$120 to register a team regardless of division selection, that's only \$30 per player! This helps to pay for the cost of running the event and allows us to provide all participants with T-shirts.

REFUNDS?

There is a no refund policy in effect for this tournament once a team has officially submitted their registration form and paid for the event. However, if Page 3v3 Street Fest is cancelled for any reason, refunds will be offered at the time of cancellation.

CAN I PLAY FOR MULTIPLE TEAMS?

In the interest of keeping teams on schedule and with full rosters for each game as well as to reduce the risk of injury, players may not register to play on more than one team.

To minimize schedule conflicts, team coaches and volunteers should not also be registered to play.

CAN I CHANGE MY ROSTER?

Yes. If your team needs to make a change to your roster, the team coach or captain just needs to <u>Click Here</u> or complete the form at Event HQ. We don't want teams to have to forfeit so, Roster Change Requests can be made at any time before or during the event.



Volunteer FAQs



CAN I HELP?

Volunteers must be 18(+) years old. They cannot also be participating in the tournament as a player or coach. Volunteers are our heroes! They can select the time slots and positions they'd prefer.

HELP HOW?

Click <u>here</u> for detailed descriptions of the different volunteer positions and shift times and to register! This big event will rely on volunteer support for Court Monitors, Scorekeepers, Event HQ, Support Staff, Event Set-up, and Event Break-down.

BASKETBALL EXPERTISE?

Basketball knowledge and experience is **not necessary** for most of the volunteer positions. Only if you want to be a Court Monitor (referee), should you have at least 3 years of experience with organized basketball (as a player, coach or referee).

WHATS IN IT FOR ME?

All Volunteers will receive a t-shirt and 5 free raffle tickets to win an event ball! Volunteers are absolutely integral to helping this inaugural event run smoothly.

IS THERE VOLUNTEER TRAINING?

Some volunteer training resources may be emailed out to volunteers along with their schedules 2 weeks before the event. There will also be brief volunteer meetings at Event HQ before every volunteer shift.

HOW AND WHEN WILL I LEARN ABOUT MY VOLUNTEER SHIFT & LOCATION?

While we will do the best that we can to schedule you for the shift times and positions that you selected on your registration form, we may ask to move folks around to best serve the event. About 2 weeks prior to the event, we will email each volunteer with the details of their individual schedule (including shift location and position) as well as with some volunteer training resources for your review. If we are not notified otherwise before Monday, February 27, 2023, it will be assumed that you agree to accept and commit to your assigned schedules.

WHAT TO WEAR? WHAT TO BRING?

Come ready to work and dress for the weather – wear comfortable athletic clothes and tennis shoes. Bring plenty of water and snacks, as well as sunscreen and a smile!
